Notes: (1) In eliciting the constructs, take the people three at a time and ask yourself the question, “*In terms of this value, in what way are two of these people similar to each other and, in what way, is the third different from the other two?*” Write the description of the similarity between the two on the left, and the distinguishing characteristic of the third on the right. (2) In each set of three, place a “O” under the person’s initials for the two who are similar and a “X” under the initials of the person who is different.
